## COL. DAVID F. MORRISSEY

Col. David F. Morrissey is the commander of the Air Force Reserve Officer Training Corp, Detachment 330, at the University of Maryland. In that capacity he directs and administers an officer training program to provide the United States Air Force with high-quality officers and leaders of character. He also chairs the Department of Aerospace Studies and manages a budget of \$1.1M. He leads six cadre members instructing a curriculum covering the foundation, doctrine, and history of the Air Force, as well as leadership fundamentals and National Security Affairs.

Colonel Morrissey earned his commission from the U.S. Air Force Academy in 1990 and his wings at Williams Air Force Base, Ariz. He has served in a variety of operations and staff positions throughout his career and has flown and commanded combat missions in Bosnia, Kosovo, and Afghanistan. He has served as the Deputy Division Chief at the Deployment and Distribution Operations Center in Stuttgart, Germany where he directed end-to-end deployment of, and logistics support for allied and coalition forces from Europe to Iraq and Afghanistan.



Prior to this assignment, Colonel Morrissey was the commander of the 12<sup>th</sup> Operations Group, 12th Flying Training Wing, Joint Base San Antonio-Randolph, Texas. He was responsible for five flying training squadrons and an operations support squadron leading 349 flying instructors, 24 enlisted members, and more than 282 DoD civilians and contractors who collectively produced 1,126 graduates per year. He is a command pilot with over 4,200 hours in the C-17, C-21 and T-1 aircraft.
